- 6. Solar Outdoor Learning Project: Schneider Electric has an OTC appointment with DSA on 2/22 for plan approval. Bulk of the construction is planned for summer of 2023.
- 7. LCAP Parent Meeting: Meeting took place on 1/26 with presentations on LCAP, school safety, and human trafficking.
- 8. Based on feedback from CRMA and the fire marshal, our maintenance staff has installed GFIs on several outlets and teachers have been directed to remove décor in classrooms that does not have the fire marshal seal.
- 9. The District is looking into purchasing a mini bus for after-school tutoring and sporting events.

- 10. The District just submitted the Hazardous Materials annual report to Madera County and maintenance staff completed the required training.
- 11. Our basketball teams have had two games; one at Washington School in Snelling; the other at home against El Nido. The girls have lost both; the boys have split 1:1.
