4.5 Superintendent Report

We ended the year with enrollment of 402; Alview 186, Dairyland 216

- Our last day of school went well; teachers all checked out on Friday with the exception of two. Almost 40 staff members attended the retirement luncheon that day.
- The Capitol Advisors Budget Workshop was held at MCSOS on Friday. There wasn't much new information. Budget predictions for the next two years are bleak. This year, we have a fully-funded 2.3% COLA with deferrals from June to July.
- We have a checklist for the upcoming Williams visit and will be meeting with our management team to prepare. MCSOS provided folders to submit documents like our FIT, textbook inventory and adoption information, etc. prior to the August visit.
- The final numbers for summer programs are at capacity for "STEM in the Wild" (20 each week; 60 total) plus 34 for the Dairyland program. Some students will overlap.
- After discussion with the architect, we have decided to pour cement under the Alview shade structure and purchase a portable stage for assemblies and library clubs. The plan is to complete the project in July. The cost of the cement is less

than the original quote after using our own staff to demolish tether ball courts and eliminating storm drainage from the plans.
