- Fencing—stronger, larger diameter posts had to be added to support gates
- Asphalt project is complete. Sealing and re-striping will begin tomorrow.
- Solar panels were cleaned at both campuses last Thursday. We will re-visit another cleaning after harvest.
- Our maintenance department struggled with stripping the Dairyland floor over the last two weeks. It may become necessary to strip annually again; the additional time set their schedule back. They have been deep cleaning rooms, painting parking lot lines, working on sprinklers etc. They are ready for school to start.
- We received our Inflation Reduction Act rebate check last week.
- The date for the Williams visit is 8/25/25. All requested documentation has been sent to the folder for review.
